Consent to verify

We need your consent before we verify your identity electronically. Review and tick the relevant box in this section to continue with confirming your identity.

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What identity documents are you providing

For where Australian Retirement Trust requests you to confirm your identity, generally we require at least one primary identifier or two secondary identifiers. A primary identifier is typically a photo ID issued by a government authority (such as a passport, driver's licence, proof of age card etc). If you don't have a primary identifier for whatever reason, you can also provide us two secondary identifiers instead (such as a notice from a government authority or utilities service).

Please tick the documents that you are providing in this section. If you're unsure about whether a document you are providing is valid for us to use, refer to the refer to Important information page details of what must be provided in documents for it to be valid proof of identification.

Providing your tax file number (TFN)

Under the Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Act 1993, your superannuation fund is authorised to collect your TFN, which will only be used for lawful purposes.

These purposes may change in the future as a result of legislative change. The trustee of your superannuation fund may disclose your TFN to another superannuation provider, when your benefits are being transferred, unless you request the trustee of your superannuation fund in writing that your TFN not be disclosed to any other superannuation provider.

It's not an offence not to quote your TFN. However giving your TFN to your superannuation fund will have the following advantages (which may not otherwise apply):

- your superannuation fund will be able to accept all types of contributions to your account/s,
- the tax on contributions to your superannuation account/s will not increase,
- other than the tax that may ordinarily apply, no additional tax will be deducted when you start drawing down your superannuation benefits, and
- it will make it much easier to trace different superannuation accounts in your name so that you receive all your superannuation benefits when you retire.

What is an acceptable identification document? Any **one** of the following documents will be

accepted as primary identification:

A current driver's licence or permit issued under a law of a State or Territory or equivalent authority of a foreign country that contains your photo, name, residential address and date of birth (please copy and certify both front and back sections if relevant). Certification must be no more than 12 months old.

- a current passport issued by the Commonwealth
- a card issued under a law of a State or Territory for the purpose of proving the person's age which contains your photo, name and date of birth (please copy and certify both front and back sections if relevant). Certification must be no more than 12 months old
- a current Proof of Age card
- a current passport or a similar document issued for the purpose of international travel or a national identity card issued for the purpose of identification that:
- 1. contains your photo, name and signature,
- 2. is issued by a foreign government, the United Nations or an agency of the United Nations, and
- 3. if it is written in a language that is not understood by the person carrying out the verification, is accompanied by an English translation prepared by an accredited translator.

If you cannot provide us with one of the documents outlined above, then we may accept any two of the documents listed in the table (right) as secondary identification. That is, one document from each of the columns in the table. It's important to note we cannot accept documents that have expired. We also reserve the right to request additional information to verify your identity.

Who can certify?

A birth certificate or birth extract issued by a State or

A citizenship certificate issued by the Commonwealth,

A citizenship certificate issued by a foreign government,

A birth certificate issued by a foreign government, the United Nations or an agency of the United Nations,

A pension card issued by the Department of Human Services that entitles you to financial benefits

A healthcare card issued by the Department of Human Services that entitles you to financial benefits.

A notice that:

a) was issued to you by the Commonwealth, a State or a Territory within the preceding 12 months,

b) contains your name and your residential address, and

c) records the provision of financial benefits to you under a law of the Commonwealth, State or Territory (as the case may be).

A notice that:

a) was issued to you by the Australian Taxation Office within the preceding 12 months,

b) contains your name and your residential address, and

c) records a debt payable to or by you to the Commonwealth under Commonwealth law relating to taxation.

A notice that:

a) was issued to you by a local government body or utilities provider within the preceding three months,

b) contains your name and your residential address, and

c) records the provision of services by that local government body or utilities provider to your address or to that person.

In relation to a person under the age of 18, a notice that:

a) was issued to you by a school principal within the preceding three months,

b) contains your name and your residential address, and records the period of time you attended the school.

What do we mean by certified?

We understand you'll want to provide us with copies of your ID documents, rather than the originals. That's fine, but you must have them 'certified' within the last 12 months. This means the certifier must:

- 1. Sight the original and the copy to make sure both documents are identical, and
- 2. Write or stamp 'certified true copy of original document' on each page, and
- 3. Sign and print their name, qualification (e.g. Justice of the Peace, Australia Post permanent employee), and the date on each page of the document.

How your proof of identity document should look.



- a) Copy of the document that identifies you
- b) Displays 'Certified true copy of original document' written or stamped and signature of authorised person
- c) Authorised person's stamp and registration number (if applicable)
- d) Name, qualification and phone number of authorised person, and
- e) Date of authorisation

Important notes on identification:

- We cannot accept documents which have expired. If an expired document is received, we won't be able to process your Proof of Identity form until suitable identification has been provided.
- If you're providing a document that isn't in English, you'll also need to provide an English translation prepared by an accredited translator. For further information on this, please call us on 13 11 84.



Consent to verify

With your consent, Australian Retirement Trust can use Equifax IDMatrix to verify your identity electronically. This program uses data held in places such as the Electoral roll, White pages, Department of Transport, the Passport Office, and Equifax credit information files to verify your details.

As part of the electronic verification process, your document details (for example your driver's licence number) will be submitted to the Australian Government's Document Verification Service (DVS). The DVS is a national online system that allows organisations to compare a customer's identification with a government record. More information about the DVS is available on their website dvs.gov.au


